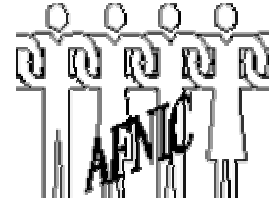

AFNIC serves neurologically-impaired children who have violent rages or tantrums. These children typically have a diagnosis of Tourette Syndrome, Aspergers, Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder, Pervasive Development Disorder Not Otherwise Specified, Attention Deficit (Hyperactivity) Disorder, or other neurologically-based disorder. The rages often involve the child's difficulties with changing activities, obsessions-compulsions, frustration, fatigue, or not getting his or her way. Sometimes the rages appear to come out of nowhere.

Parents and schools typically address this problem through traditional reward and punishment methods. Unfortunately, those methods do not solve the underlying neurological disability, so do not solve the problem. Indeed, because punishment increases the child's frustration, the reward and punishment system actually *escalates* the problem by causing more rages.
